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Pragmatic traits of Italian sentence adverbs in context

Abstract:

Sentence Adverbs semantically contribute to the sentence in which they occur in various ways. They can modify the event denoted (*John travels rarely*), the propositional content (*Hopefully, John will travel*), or the speech act of the associated utterance (*Frankly, John should travel more*). They have been classified following these peculiar semantic functions (see, e.g., Dik et al. 1990); however, not all the forms can be placed into specific subclasses (see, a.o., Ramat/Ricca 1998).

In our colloquium, I will introduce two ongoing studies on Italian borderline cases: the functional class of domain adverbs and the lexeme *davvero* 'really'. Domain adverbs can be considered a borderline case in that they have been variably classified as modifying the propositional content or the speech act; while *davvero* can be identified both as an intensifier (*davvero bello* 'really beautiful') or as a modal adverb (*Mi piace davvero John* 'I really like John'). These hybrid syntactic and semantic behaviours have consequences on the use of these sentence adverbs, corresponding to peculiar pragmatic traits variably interacting with the context. In particular, as far as domain adverbs are concerned, I will show that their peculiar syntactic, informational and semantic traits interact with pragmatic discourse functions (Cimmino in prep.). These correlations will be exemplified in online journalistic texts. As for *davvero*, I will focus on its pragmatic contribution to spoken and written texts. I will show that in persuasive contexts, such as political speeches, online political debated and advertising, it can trigger polemic implicit contents (Cimmino/Cominetti 2023).
