1. Information for seminar papers and theses

If you would like to write your thesis with a local governance focus at the Institute of Local Government Studies (KWI), please send your short summary to Peter.Ulrich@uni-potsdam.de and make an appointment. The possible topics and requirements for registration can be found on our website. This page will also help you if you have not yet decided on a topic. Please also note the deadlines for registering your Bachelor's or Master's thesis and submitting your topic assignment form. If you are working on a thesis with Dr. Peter Ulrich as your first supervisor, you will need a professor as your second supervisor. Compatible professors include Prof. Dr. Sabine Kuhlmann and Prof. Dr. Julia Fleischer. Compatible colloquia also take place with these professors. Dr. Peter Ulrich is also available as a second supervisor.

Your bachelor's thesis is your first real academic challenge, which you will have to organize and plan yourself. This includes finding your own topic, operationalizing and analysis.

The thesis should begin with a title page. This title page should include: Name, matriculation number, degree program, semester, UP e-mail, title of the thesis, submission date, word count, names of the first and second supervisors of your thesis.

This is followed by a table of contents, a list of abbreviations, your text, bibliography, list of figures and tables, appendices, and a signed affidavit.

We recommend you to use a reference management software for your thesis. You can obtain a license for Citavi from the university. Other free alternatives are Zotero and Mendeley. The KWI citation guidelines apply, which are based closely on the American citation style.

2. Applicable formalities and requirements for seminar papers and theses

The same formalities apply to theses and seminar papers.

Please use justified text and a conventional font (e.g. Arial or Times New Roman/11, 12pt.), a line spacing of 1.5, and standard margins (approx. 2-2.5 cm).

3. Citation style

The American Harvard-style citation style with in-text citations is preferred for KWI papers. Alternatively, the German citation style with footnotes may also be possible.

A consistent and unified form of citation is mandatory.

Sources are cited in short form and in brackets directly in the text (in the American citation style) with the author's name and the year of publication as well as a page reference (e.g. "Schmidt 2017: 25"). If it is not a quotation but an indirect quotation, a "cf." is placed in front of the parenthesis. If there are more than three authors, name the first author and add "et al.".

Directly quoted sentences do not end with a period within the quotation. This is inserted after the reference or at the end of the (non-cited) sentence.

The complete list of sources is given in a bibliography (see below).

Detailed references to laws, guidelines, regulations, or other legal documents should be presented in the footnote.

4. bibliography

The bibliography and the references of a book should be prepared according to the Harvard citation style and sorted alphabetically.
