

#### Job Announcement

The Faculty of Human Sciences, Structural Unit of Educational Sciences, at the **University of Potsdam** invites applications for two positions, each initially limited to three years:

# Academic Staff Member (f/m/d) ID no. /375/2024

The successful candidate will work 40 hours per week (100 %). The position is classified within remuneration group 13 of the collective wage agreement among the German federal states ("Tarifvertrag für den öffentlichen Dienst der Länder" – TV-L). The fixed term of employment is in accordance with Section 2 subsection 1 of the German Act on Fixed-Term Employment Contracts in Science and Academia (Wissenschaftszeitvertragsgesetz, WissZeitVG). An extension of the contract is possible if personal and legal requirements are met.

### Your Field of Work:

The position is located within the Structural Unit of Educational Sciences. The focus of the Process-Oriented Classroom Research Group is on analyzing classroom interactions, teaching quality, and the contextual conditions of instruction using a broad range of empirical research methods and study designs. The goal is to provide evidence-based insights for the design and optimization of teaching and to contribute to the professional development of educators.

## The Scope of Your Responsibilities:

- Conducting primary and secondary empirical studies in the field of classroom research
- Designing experimental studies in the field of teaching and learning research
- Analyzing process data, such as eye-tracking, behavioral, and momentary data
- Teaching two courses in educational science or educational psychology
- Administrative tasks related to teaching and students examinations
- Contributing to self-administration and the organizational tasks of the Faculty of Humanities

Further academic qualifications, including a post-doctoral thesis (Habilitation), are possible. At least one-third of the working hours will be reserved for dedicated academic research.

Teaching obligations based on the requirements of the Teaching Obligations Ordinance (LehrVV) of the State of Brandenburg, as amended, and the <u>Regulation for Calculating Teaching Load</u> that was passed by the Senate of the University of Potsdam. This position is assigned to the group of academic staff, with the opportunity for further qualification (Doctorate/Habilitation).

- Nationally and internationally visible research as well as a strong interest in academic work
